## **Course Description**

The course aims to introduce the basic techniques and materials of pictorial representation such as color mixing, color composition, the depiction of light and form through painterly means. It also targets on the students' development of a personal vision through the investigation of various issues in painting through a "visual diary" created during the excursions and trips included in this course.

Ms Maria Yiannoura is an MA Fine Art graduate from the Surrey Institute of Art & Design, U.K., a BA Painting graduate from the Academy of Fine Arts, Rome, Italy and also holds an Associate degree in Graphic & Interior Design from Intercollege, Cyprus. She is a faculty member of the Design Department of Intercollege since 2004 and also an active member of the Artistic Society of Cyprus, participating in numerous exhibitions every year.

## **Course Outline**

**Class Sessions:** 

- 1. Theory of color/ color mixing exercises (acrylics)- double session
- 2. Exploring tone through colors (acrylics)- still life
- 3. Color balance, composition and proportion (acrylics) still life
- 4. Interpreting and communicating color and techniques (watercolors) landscape
- 5. Abandoning perspective (watercolors) still life
- 6. Drawing from multiple viewpoints (chalk pastels) still life
- 7. Moving towards abstraction still life (oil pastels)
- 8. Working outside a rectangle still life (acrylics)
- 9. Explore light in color landscape (chalk & oil pastels)
- 10. Deconstructing the form landscape (acrylics)
- 11. Expressive Gesture Form (mixed media)
- 12. Explore balance and harmony in abstract forms (mixed media)
- 13. Final assessment

#### **Tasks and Assignments**

This is mainly a studio course but it also includes site visits (excursion to mountain-village and sea sites) that can be combined with brief outdoor projects on landscape painting by using watercolors, oil and chalk pastels. Site visits also include a cruise to the Greek islands and a trip to Athens and Rome, where the students will have the opportunity to visit museums and monuments and at the same time explore issues in painting through assigned projects. Through studio assignments, students will explore a variety of approaches to acrylic, watercolor, chalk and oil pastels painting in order to become competence using these techniques and materials.
