### **Course Aims and Objectives**

To develop knowledge and understanding of the similarities and differences in accounting thought, principles and procedures in other countries, examine on-going institutional attempts toward worldwide and/or regional standardization, and assess the expanded reporting responsibilities caused by such developments as the emergence of multinational firms as significant economic and social force, the abandonment of stable international currency systems, rising prices, and the international diversification of securities investments.

#### **Teaching Methods**

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, presentations, tutorials and practical exercises and assignments.
