Course Aims and Objectives

This course seeks to allow students to develop deeper insights into several of the ethnic minorities which have become part of the urban landscape in Cyprus in the last 20 years, with a view to deepening the understanding of cultural differences in general, and of the particular groups in particular. The course aims to increase insight and empathy into the dilemmas of migrant workers as they enter the cultural space of Cyprus. The course will examine appropriate writings about peoples from three cultural areas – the Arab world, Eastern Europe, and Southwestern Asia [Sri Lanka].

Teaching Methods

Interactive lectures; student presentations of summaries of required readings; films where appropriate; guided classroom dialogues with members of the ethnic minorities being studied, where possible, to obtain their perspectives on migration and living in Cyprus.

Course Teaching Hours

42 hours. The course is delivered during the Fall and Spring semesters in 14-weeks (3 hours/week).
