- Placement of the figure in space (in perspective)
- Gesture drawings.
- · Anatomical studies of hands and feet.
- Portrait drawings and self portraits with a variety of expressions.
- Imaginary figure drawings and portraits.

Course Aims and Objectives

The course is designed to develop the students' abilities in the art of figure drawing with emphasis on the study of anatomy and creative representation of the human body. Composition will be stressed throughout the class as well as successful rendition of volume through the use of light and dark shades. Students will have the chance to experience different techniques through the media of pencil and charcoal in order to evoke texture, movement and mood in their drawings.

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, studio presentations, studio tutorials and practical exercises and assignments.
