Course Description

Primary or secondary research; study of a firm or an industry or a business topic both from a theoretical as well as from a practical business point of view; writing a properly structured and documented report in effective English.

The specific topics to be covered would relate to the items contained in the student's Proposal, as it would be approved by the "Student Project Advisor". As the various key chapters of the Report would be prepared, they are submitted for comments by the Advisor. The Project Report, together with a final presentation which is in the form of a 15-20 minutes oral presentation, is assessed by a three-person Committee. Following a satisfactory outcome, the student submits the Final Copy of his/her Report as an evidence of the work done.

Course Aims and Objectives

To provide the student with an opportunity to integrate his/her knowledge and understanding of the various business related courses into a project that can be implemented in a given business situation, or to review a given business problem.

Teaching Methods

The Student Advisor offers guidance both through the issue of General and Specific Guidelines as well as by holding 3-4 sessions with the student to review the quality, the structure and the style of the way the various chapters are developed and written.

Course Teaching Hours

The work involved requires a time input by the student equivalent to that of a 6 ECTS course, though the actual number of hours of work would, in practice, be substantially more.

Evaluation and Grading

The assessment is based on the quality of the work as contained in the Report , on the way the student presents the key items and findings of his project and on the understanding shown of the various concepts involved
