The course introduces the students to the creation of basic navigational interaction through the understanding of usability tips. Students will also learn to review several web sites carrying both Good and Bad design features where they are expected to create creative thinking as to situate their final project into a more functional interface. More specifically the following topics are covered: Target audience, Navigational structures, Design features, Interface styles, Rollover buttons, Guide layers, Interaction with labels, Non-linear structures of narrative.

Course Aims and Objectives

To introduce students to the concepts and techniques of Interactive Multimedia Development through the creation of functional interfaces. The course enables students to develop a better understanding of multimedia and explore the possibilities it has to offer with the use of the Macromedia Flash software

Teaching Methods

The teaching method will consist of lecturers, CD-ROM exploration, web site critique, projection of relevant material, practical exercises based on personal or team work, assignments and individual guidance

Course Teaching Hours

42 hours (18 hours lectures/presentations + 24 hours laboratory work). The course is delivered during the Fall or Spring semesters in 14-weeks (3 hours/week).
