Course Description

Emphasis is given on writing an interview, reporting skills, the importance of language, developing personal style in News writing and organizing a news magazine. Finally the whole class produce a half hour news magazine

Course Aims and Objectives

A course that prepares students to write and report news packages for radio. Students learn to identify, research, write and produce news.
