Course Description

Introduction to the Visual Arts is a survey course which examines developments in art starting fro the Cave paintings and ending with the early Renaissance. The early arts of India and China are also covered. Emphasis lies on (1) the meanings and functions assigned to the visual arts during the periods which we will be considering and (2) various characteristics of the works we are looking at – e.g. the "style", subject matter", in which they were made – related to these prevailing towards art and its meanings.
