This course aims to the understanding of the range of illustration in commercial and editorial design, from the simplest line drawings, to compositions, investigating the latest in computer technology. It introduces students to the use of illustration as a central feature in graphics and it's role as a powerful and highly effective medium. This course encourages research from different points of view (psychological, political, economical, sociological, philosophical etc) and improves awareness on how a creative team can work to produce highly realistic illustrations.

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, studio presentations, studio tutorials and practical exercises and assignments.
