Course Aims and Objectives

The course presents advanced problems in design dealing with complex interior and environmental problems emphasizing the planning of large scale institutional and public buildings. Students are encouraged to use their so far obligatory experience of different constructional/structural models and their aesthetic properties to choose aptly and with sensibility from the full range of possibilities. The course also studies how the luminous and acoustic aspects of design can be manipulated to facilitate the activities to be sheltered and explores how they can control objective mood and convey symbolic values.

Teaching Methods

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, studio presentations, studio tutorials and practical exercises and assignments.
