Course Aims and Objectives

The course examines specific philosophical issues that arise in connection with painting, film and photography with special attention to questions of meta-aesthetics (what makes something a work of art?), normative aesthetics (what makes something a good work of art?), the theory of aesthetic representation (what is it for a painting or a photograph or a film to represent something?) and aesthetic realism (what does it mean to say that, e.g. a painting is realistic and is its being so a source of aesthetic value?). The course studies problems and questions around the philosophy of art through both traditional and contemporary texts.

Teaching Methods

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, studio presentations, studio tutorials and practical exercises and assignments.

Course Teaching Hours

42 hours. The course is delivered during the Spring and Fall semesters in 14-weeks (3 hours/week).
