Course Description

This course provides the student with an introduction to the unfolding and actualization of both the exoteric and esoteric aspects of the religious dimensions of life, in and through the exploration of the world's great "religions". In this regard students are given the opportunity to explore diverse traditions like Hinduism, Buddhism, Confucianism, Taoism, Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. The course also provides avenues for exploring in some depth historical contextual ties, theological considerations, philosophies of religion, along with issues of individual, cultural and collective creativities, hermeneutics and methodologies, both from within a religious praxis and from the "outside" (through the interpretive powers of 'other' traditions, cultures and praxes). The students are asked to concretely formulate foundational and paradigmatic features of the religious mind and experience. Most importantly, due to the unique dimensions of the subject matter the students are encouraged and provoked to reflect upon the diversity of the human condition and deep questions concerning the "options" we humans have explored or are presently adventuring.
