Course Aims and Objectives

The European Union is present on the world stage in three main roles: Common Commercial Policy, Development Aid Policy, and External Relations. The EU is the world's largest trading entity and the largest provider of funds for the developing countries. The course examines in detail all three policies and how the EU ensures that trade liberalization between it and the developing and developed countries alike is coherent with global trade liberalization efforts.
