Course Description

This is a Thesis of theoretical or empirical research undertaken on a business topic in any one of the areas of study in the MSc in Hospitality Management. This is expected to be an independent project by the MSc Candidates on a topic of their own choice in consultation with the Director of the MSc Program. Subsequent to the approval of such a Thesis Proposal, a Thesis Supervisor is appointed from among the MSc Faculty members of Intercollege to work closely with the MSc Candidate. The Thesis is expected to result in a written Thesis of about 15,000 words of text; all appendices, lists and non-text materials are in addition to the above length. Initially, and for the purpose of Proposal approval, the MSc Candidate is expected to choose a focused title, to formulate the problem by expressing it in clear and presentable terms, to define the methodology of required research (primary and/or secondary) relevant to the scope of the agreed work, and to establish the framework for the work in the form of a Table of Contents, i.e. a list of chapters and subchapters. In addition, a preliminary list of reference materials (books, articles, journals etc) must be included in the Proposal.

The Thesis counts for 4 credits, which is a substantial portion of the MSc degree credits. Therefore, it requires considerable effort and thought. In order to pass the Thesis requirements (oral and written), the MSc Candidate needs to obtain a minimum grade of B- or above. Exceptionally good papers can earn a distinction grade of A.
