Course Aims and Objectives

The course aims to provide a background to contemporary Middle Eastern politics, starting from the collapse of the Ottoman Empire and ending to the Arab- Israeli peace making of 1990's. Following a brief review of the modern history of the region, it will introduce the main historical themes which have tended to trigger off and control the main political currents. Country analyses and case studies will also form part of the syllabus. Students will be offered a framework of analysis wherein various political activities in the region can be better and more deeply understood.
