It will draw on a number of contemporary case studies of ethnic conflict, and will examine how the interstate system itself may contribute to the exacerbation of such problems. It will also outline techniques for the settlement and alleviation of ethnic conflict, through peacekeeping, peacemaking and peacebuilding strategies. Finally the role of the UN is examined pertaining to ethnic conflict and settlement strategies.
