### Course Description

The course includes the following topics: The relationship between what is said and what is conveyed, the interpretation of the speaker's utterance expressing a belief, the role of syntactic structure in interpretation, how do language users understand each other? Sense and reference, Semantic ambiguities, Cross-cultural and cross-linguistic semantics, Speech acts, Reference and Inference, Presuppositions, Cooperation and Implicature, Politeness and Interaction, Relation of pragmatics to syntax and semantics.

### Course Aims and Objectives

The goal of the course is to acquaint students with some basic concepts and problems central to the study of semantics and pragmatics within current linguistic theory. The course will look at the variety of meanings which words and other linguistic expressions can encode, the nature of communication and the relation between language and communication.

Teachers may also use a mix of lectures, tutorials, case studies, student presentations, group work, role play, literature review, analysis of research data, and field visits and have visiting specialists give lectures.
