Course Aims and Objectives

This course offers students the opportunity to develop in the area of research, using both quantitative and qualitative methods, in the fields of language studies, and literature. The course covers applied linguistics research methods through a combination of: quantitative statistics and qualitative methods, readings, and critical analysis of research articles. In the area of research in the field of literature the students are given the opportunity to develop an understanding and ability to apply themselves to the major approaches in this discipline. Students will have therefore the opportunity to understand the main trends in literary research as practiced by the various schools of thought in the field of literature. Once the essential components of a range of different methods are grasped, students are encouraged to apply these ideas and skills to the development of their research project for LALI-495 Research Project I, and LALI-496 Research Project II in which the students complete a major research project.

Teaching Methods

Facilities are available for PowerPoint lecture presentations, VCRs, Online Computers, Computer Labs. Teachers may also use a mix of lectures, tutorials, case studies, student presentations, group work, role play, literature review, analysis of research data, and field visits and have visiting specialists give lectures.
