Course Description

Legal research. Using the law library and other resources. Reading cases, extracting the legal rule from the case, the doctrine of precedent. Statutory interpretation, familiarity with legal terminology, answering legal problems, using authority. The ability to communicate and manipulate legal material in both written and verbal situations. Computer skills. Using the computer to research and to prepare documents. Learning skills. Function of lectures, seminars and other group learning. Reading and note-making, listening and note-taking. Essay writing. Working in groups. Oral presentations.

Course Aims and Objectives

Course is designed to enable the student to learn effectively; to develop skills of written and oral communication, and argument; to support substantive law courses by developing the ability to discover, interpret and apply legal rules; to engender a critical approach to the study of law; and to introduce the student to both computers in general and legal databases in particular.

Teaching Methods

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, presentations, and practical exercises and assignments.

Course Teaching Hours

42 hours (28 hours lectures/presentations + 14 hours library work). The course is delivered during the Fall and Spring semesters in 14-weeks (3 hours/week).
