Course Description

During the course the students will cover the following:

1. A general introduction in English Administrative Law and detailed study of English Administrative Law as it developed in the various stages.
2. Some comparative aspects of continental Administrative Law, particularly French and German.
3. Delegated Legislation and Prerogative Powers – Judicial Review of Prerogative Powers.
4. Local Government.
5. Tribunals and Inquiries.
6. Natural Justice – Fair hearing, reasonableness and proportionality.
7. Judicial Review – Remedies.
8. The Parliamentary Commissioner for Administration.

Course Aims and Objectives

The course is designed to give the students a general introduction in English Administrative Law, followed by a detailed study of the main aspects of the subject. Students will study the main grounds of judicial review (the available remedies) and the structure of local government in England and Wales.

Teaching Methods

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, discussions, presentations, and problem-solving activities.

Course Teaching Hours

42 hours (30 hours of lectures, 12 hours of seminars/tutorials and student-led presentation/seminars). The course is delivered during the Spring semester in 14 weeks (3 hours/week).
