#### **Course Aims and Objectives**

The course aims to familiarize students with the terminology, the principles and the concepts of the law of contract; to develop an appreciation of legal method, particularly the ability to apply the concepts and theories to practical situations; to enable the students to analyze and evaluate the classification of contractual terms and the legal principles on which the formation of a contract is based; to understand the development of case law and the development of common law rules in their historical, political and socio-economic context; to understand the case law and to develop the ability to understand contract cases, the importance of the issues in a case and how the courts have resolved the issues; to develop and formulate proposals of reform; and to understand tensions between the established legal principles and their operation in everyday commercial practice

#### **Teaching Methods**

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, discussions, presentations, and problem-solving activities.

# **Course Teaching Hours**

42 hours (30 hours of lectures, 12 hours of seminars/tutorials and student-led presentation/seminars). The course is delivered during the Fall semester in 14 weeks (3 hours/week).
