Course Description

This course is designed to concentrate on the economic aspects of community competence. The course will emphasize three main issues: freedom of movement, competition law and the implementation of the single market. Movement towards a single currency, of contemporary importance, will also be considered.

Course Aims and Objectives

The course aims to guide the student in an exploration of the legal aspects of the free movement of goods, capital and workers throughout the European Union, to introduce the student to the basic theory of competition law and the single market, and of the protection of intellectual property.

Teaching Methods

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, discussions, presentations, and problem-solving activities.

Course Teaching Hours

42 hours (33 hours lectures/presentations + 9 hours problem solving). The course is delivered during the Fall semester in 14-weeks (3 hours/week).
