Course Description

Nuisance. The principle in Rylands v Fletcher; Occupier's liability. Liability of employers. Product liability; Defamation and malicious falsehood; Defences and remedies.

Course Aims and Objectives

Course designed to examine the wide variety of miscellaneous torts. Students will be guided to examine the torts which interfere with the person and those which interfere with his interest in land, in his reputation, and in his economic well-being. The students will finally examine remedies and defences and other considerations of liability.

Teaching Methods

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, presentations, and practical exercises and assignments.

Course Teaching Hours

42 hours (30 hours of lectures, 12 hours of seminars/tutorials and student-led presentation/seminars). The course is delivered during the Spring semester in 14 weeks (3 hours/week).
