- 1. The principle of good faith: Meanings and effects. Good faith in treaty relations. The problem of abuse of rights. Estoppel.
- 2. The principle of international responsibility: Meaning. Standards. Limits. Reparation. Self-help.
- The principle of freedom of the seas: Delimitation of maritime frontiers. Sea-bed and subsoil. Freedom of navigation, fisheries and other users. Contiguous zones, hot pursuit and other limitations on freedom of the seas.
- 4. The principle of self-defence: Self-defence in times of peace. Compulsory measures short of war. Legal and illegal war. State and effects of war.
- 5. International order and organization: The problem of an international constitutional law. Types and functions of international institutions. The problem of the enforcement of legal rights.
