Course Aims and Objectives

This course is the second part of Land Law, and is designed to further acquaint students with the rights and other interests in/over land. Proprietary rights and restrictive covenants will be studied. The course also aims to acquaint students with the different legal effects and implications of licenses, easements, and profits a prendre. Moreover, it is aimed at distinguishing estates in land from interests in/over land. The semester will conclude with the consideration of the doctrine of adverse possession.

Teaching Methods

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, discussions, presentations, and problem-solving activities.
