- 5. Intestacy; wills; administration of estates; Trusts.
- 6. Procedure and evidence: proof of foreign law; recognition and enforcement of foreign judgments and decrees.

Course Aims and Objectives

The course continues with the conflict of laws relating to the person. Property rights and private obligations are considered during the bulk of the semester. It concluding with matters relating to jurisdiction, justifiability and enforceability.
