### Course Description

1. The nature and scope of administrative law.
2. The legal status and powers of administrative authorities.
3. The Crown, ministers, civil service including executive agencies; local authorities; regulatory agencies; other public authorities.
4. Processes in public administration; legislation and delegated legislation; discretion, rule-making; policies; adjudication; consultation; allocation of function.
5. Judicial review. Procedures and remedies of judicial review of administrative action
6. Grounds for judicial review illegality, procedural impropriety, irrationality and legitimate expectation.
7. Exclusion of judicial review.

### Course Aims and Objectives

Course designed to examine the theory and practice of Administrative Law; to give particular attention to the various authorities and their jurisdiction and powers; to examine judicial review.
