- 5. Different types of companies; The name of the company and the role of the Registrar of Companies.
- 6. The relations between the company and outsiders.
- 7. The growth and decline of the doctrines of ultra vires and constructive notice; the Turquand rule and the application of principles of agency; The commission of crimes and torts by the company.
- 8. Vicarious liability and the Alter Ego doctrine.
- 9. The relations between the company and its members and among the members inter se.
- 10. The contract between the company and its members, different capabilities of members; altering the contract and the remedies for breach.

To introduce the student to the nature of legal and corporate personality, to examine the rules which govern the function of a company and the relations between the company and outsiders and between the company and its members.
