Course Aims and Objectives

The semester will begin by considering the important, but separate, topic on charitable trusts, including the cy-pres doctrine. Much of the semester, however, shifts the emphasis from the nature/type of trusts to the duties/rights of trustees. The course will conclude with consideration of the remedies for breach of trust, including tracing.

Teaching Methods

The course is delivered through a mixture of lectures, discussions, presentations, and problem-solving activities.

Course Teaching Hours

42 hours (30 hours of lectures, 12 hours of seminars/tutorials and student-led presentation/seminars). The course is delivered during the Spring semester in 14 weeks (3 hours/week).
