At the end of the Semester an Academic Exam will take place. The student must present a programme which includes at least one work from each of three of the following four sections (Tuned Percussion, Timpani, Snare Drum, Multiple Percussion)

Any other suitable pieces of equivalent standard can be added to the above list at the teacher's discretion. The tutor will provide sight-reading exercises.

A Technical Exam will take place at Mid-Term which consists of scales, etudes and part of the programme. At the end of the Semester an Academic Exam will take place which consists of 5 contrasting pieces and one concerto. The tutor will provide sight-reading exercises.
