This course is a part of a two-term sequence in Introductory Psychology. This course will introduce students to the psychological processes that differentiate human behavior. Psychology is the scientific study of human behavior. This course offers review and discussion on special topics, theories and methods in different areas of contemporary psychology such as developmental psychology, social psychology, health psychology, clinical psychology, cognitive psychology. It will seek to engage students in raising important psychological questions and attempt to answer them. More specifically the following topics will be covered: Psychology's scientific methods, biological foundations of behavior, human development, sensation and perception, states of consciousness, learning, memory, thinking and language.
