Course Aims and Objectives

This course is a survey for psychological testing, psychometric principles, and assessment principles. This introduction aims to develop critical analytical skills and a general understanding of published research and assessment instruments. The course will also present to the students a chance to understand how assessment instruments are developed and used and the questions that need to be answered before an instrument is deemed to be ready for use outside the psychological labs. Overall, students will learn how to select tests, evaluate their strengths and weaknesses, and how to be sensitive to ethical and psychometric issues.
