Course Aims and Objectives

The primary goal of the course is to gain an in-depth understanding of the major theoretical and perspectives of life-span development and the ways in which they explain developmental changes. Upon completion of this course students should have gained insight into: 1) the basic percepts of life-span development; 2) methodological designs most commonly used in the study of life-span development; 3) the basic predictors and potential sources of developmental change and 4) the ways in which social, political, cultural trends affect individual development.
