Course Description

This course is the first of a two semester capstone seminar designed to prepare students to conceptualize, evaluate, and present clinical cases and to prepare students for employment in a health care environment that increasingly emphasizes professional accountability. Topics covered include case conceptualization, treatment planning, empirically supported treatments, researching and writing case-focused literature reviews, single-case and N=1 research methodology, writing case studies and treatment reports. Students are required to be concurrently enrolled in PSY-550.

Course Aims and Objectives
