- 3. Critical considerations of, among other topics, feminism, postmodernism, homophobia, the mythopoetic men's movement, black English masculinities, Anglo-Cypriot men, military and the police force

Course Aims and Objectives

The overall aim of the course is to enable students to appreciate and to participate in current debates about the nature and function of men and masculinities in our society

Teaching Methods

The course is organised as 'sessions' rather than strictly following a lecture and seminar format. Each week the lecturer will give a formal presentation, but this may be followed by class participation in a workshop, formal seminar, or a video presentation followed by class discussion. Students will be briefed in advance of necessary preparation for future class presentations

Course Teaching Hours
