#### **Course Aims and Objectives**

This course will familiarize the student with a range of issues in sociological theory relating to: the definitions of the family; the organization of kinship in pre-industrial societies, including patrilineal, matrilineal and bilateral descent systems; the modes of marriage payment which accompany these systems; the importance of post-marital residence as an organizational principle; the concept of a development cycle of household, the range of relationships from informal to formal marriage, to the problem of the relationship between industrialization and the forms of the family; the problem of caring for the elderly in modern late-marriage and low-fertility societies; the special position of children in late modernity; the problem of divorce in industrial societies; adoption; and non-standard [gay and lesbian] forms of companionate relationships. The course will consider functionalist, Marxist, and feminist approaches to family issues.

#### **Teaching Methods**

Interactive lectures; classroom presentations by students of summaries of required readings; films where appropriate; guided discussions.

#### **Course Teaching Hours**

42 hours. The course is delivered during the Spring semester in 14-weeks (3 hours/week).
