Teaching methods will include lectures, skill-building activities, films, discussions, and guest speakers. Based upon this addiction model, other dependencies will then be examined, primarily through student research and class presentations.

### **Topic Areas**

- 1. Concepts of addition, powerless, and compulsion.
- 2. A primary focus of this course is chemical dependency. Students will specifically:
  - Know different theories and perspectives of this problem.
  - · Identification chemical dependency in clients.
  - The nature of treatment, therapeutic goals, and the continuum of care/resources available.
  - Develop beginning skills in working with this population.
  - Learn the varying roles of the courts, law enforcement, and other social institution sin addressing chemical dependency.
- 3. Identifying other addictions and master the above-mentioned objectives, a through e, for each of these addictions.
- 4. Identify various effects of addiction upon family dynamics and upon family members as individuals, and will develop some beginning skills in working with these persons.
- 5. The 12 step model and the self-help movement.
